

GEORGE-LITTLE ROCK COMMUNITY SCHOOL  
BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES  
January 8, 2014

The George-Little Rock Board of Education met in special session on January 8, 2014 in the Superintendent's office at George. President Amy Jurrens called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M. with board members Doug Krull, Ryan Klingenberg, and Wade Netten present. Curt Fiedler was absent. Also present were Superintendent Steve Barber, Secretary Delinda Kruger, and guest Valecia West.

A motion to adopt the agenda was made by Netten, seconded by Krull, and carried 4-0.

The board discussed the fire prevention system in the George Elementary. In 2012, the district was cited by the State Fire Marshal's office to replace all doors, glass, and wood framing that needed to be fire-rated. Currently the doors contain louvers and corridor glass which are not fire-rated. Based upon the recommendation from Associated Consulting Engineering, Inc. of Sioux Falls, a sprinkler system with full fire detection alarms would meet the requirements of the State Fire Marshal, while providing protection to our students and staff in case of a fire. The projected cost of this project would be \$110,485.

A motion to accept the preliminary estimate of probable costs in the amount of \$110,485 from Koch-Hazard Architects was made by Krull, seconded by Klingenberg, and carried 4-0.

A grant application to the Lyon County Riverboat Foundation for the "Fire Detection and Sprinkler System" was submitted for board approval. This project would require matching funds from the district in the amount of \$55,243 if approved. A motion was made by Klingenberg, seconded by Netten and carried 4-0 to approve the resolution letter and application.

A grant application to the Lyon County Riverboat Foundation from Health Services of Lyon County was presented for board approval. A motion was made by Krull, seconded by Klingenberg, and carried 4-0 to approve the application.

The next meeting will be held on January 20 at 7:00 P.M. in George, with a work session to precede at 6:00 P.M.

A motion to adjourn was made by Netten, seconded by Krull, and carried 4-0.
