

GEORGE-LITTLE ROCK COMMUNITY SCHOOL
BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES
October 18, 2011

The George-Little Rock Board of Education held its organizational meeting on October 18, 2011 in the Middle School library at Little Rock. Secretary Delinda Kruger called the meeting to order at 5:00 P.M. with the following in attendance: Board member Terrence Clark, board-elect members Curt Fiedler, Amy Jurrens, and Doug Krull; Superintendent Janel Guse; Principals Michael Munson and Molly Schilling; Secretary Delinda Kruger; and guests Kristi Donaker, Valecia West, Melinda DeLeeuw, Tana Meyer, Lissa Harson, Jeff Benson, and Travis Squires. Ryan Klingenberg was absent.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Krull, seconded by Clark, and carried 4-0.

Board Secretary Kruger canvassed the votes of the September 13 election. A total of 115 votes were cast in George, and 28 in Little Rock. Curt Fiedler received 85 write-in votes, defeating incumbent Donell Nagel who received 49; Doug Krull -129; and Amy Jurrens - 128. The oath of office was administered to Curt Fiedler, Doug Krull, and Amy Jurrens.

The Secretary called for nominations for president pro-tem. A motion to nominate Amy Jurrens was made by Krull, seconded by Clark, and carried 4-0.

President pro-tem Jurrens called for nominations for president. Clark moved to nominate Amy Jurrens, second by Krull, carried 4-0. Jurrens was named president.

A motion was made by Fiedler, seconded by Clark, and carried 4-0 to name Doug Krull as vice-president.
