

GEORGE-LITTLE ROCK COMMUNITY SCHOOL
BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES
September 17, 2012

The George-Little Rock Board of Education held its organizational meeting immediately following the regular meeting on September 17, 2012. President Amy Jurrens called the meeting to order with the following board members present: Doug Krull, Ryan Klingenberg, and Terrence Clark. Also present were Superintendent Janel Guse, Principals Mike Munson and Molly Schilling, Secretary Delinda Kruger, and guests Valecia West and Lynette Kruger.

A motion to adopt the agenda was made by Krull, seconded by Clark, and carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Krull, and seconded by Klingenberg and carried 4-0 to nominate Amy Jurrens for President pro-tem.

President pro-tem Jurrens called for nominations for President. A motion was made by Krull, seconded by Clark, and carried 4-0 to name Amy Jurrens as President.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Klingenberg, and carried 4-0 to name Doug Krull as Vice-President.
