

GEORGE-LITTLE ROCK COMMUNITY SCHOOL  
BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

The George-Little Rock Board of Education met for work session at 7:00 pm on May 16, 2016 at the George High School Library. The hiring process and coaching standards to build programs for the future, along with summer school were discussed with Principal Range and Athletic Director Glanzer addressing the board.

Following the work session, a special session was held in the High School Library in George. Board President Doug Krull called the meeting to order at 7:45 pm with the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance. Board members present were Doug Krull, Wade Netten, Todd Klein, Curt Fiedler, and Ryan Klingenberg. Also in attendance were Superintendent Steve Barber, Board Secretary Cathy Bonestroo, and guests Valecia West, Dawn Arends, Geraldine Hassebroek, Apryl Henrichs, Kim Dykstra, and Darcy Hansmann. A quorum was established. Citizens were invited to address the board with no discussion brought forward.

An adopted agenda was requested to add Darcy Eben to the recommendations for hire. A motion to approve the adopted agenda was made by Netten, seconded by Fiedler, and carried 5-0.

The new summer reading support position job description was reviewed. Superintendent Barber shared more hires may be necessary pending final summer school numbers.

Superintendent Barber made the following recommendations for hire: Darcy Eben and Apryl Henrichs as summer reading support at \$12.00 per hour including the transportation. A motion to approve was made by Netten, seconded by Klingenberg, and carried 5-0. A motion to approve Jordan Kruse and Allyssa Krull as summer reading support including transportation at \$11.00 per hour was made by Klingenberg, seconded by Fiedler, and carried 4-0 with Krull abstaining. A motion to approve Levi Judge as Head Boys' Basketball coach was made by Klingenberg. President Krull temporarily passed meeting control to Vice-President Fiedler and seconded the motion. Vote was 2-3 with motion failing. Fiedler passed meeting control back to President Krull. The resignation was pulled as requested.

A motion to adjourn was made by Netten, seconded by Fiedler, and carried 5-0.
