The Girls State Program was started in hopes of teaching young women about the political process. Girls State is a "learning by doing" program which takes the girls through the entire political process. Early in the week the girls elect their mayors, city council, transact city business, pass city ordinances, and work on a city project for judging later. They campaign to get their parties candidates elected and create party loyalty and eventually elect country and state officials. During the week the American Legion Auxiliary Department president tells the girls about the various Auxiliary programs. They have speakers throughout the week that talk about a variety of subjects. They have a program about the Flag etiquette, a scavenger hunt to create team building and a candle lighting ceremony and get to shop at the ISU book store. DRESS CODE-For ALL High School Students: Seems like we are having a little issue with the dress code. Here is a list of inappropriate clothing that should not be worn:

- * Spaghetti straps, midriff tops, muscle shirts, short shorts or skirts as well as low cut tops or extremely tight clothing is inappropriate. The bottom hem of the shorts/skirt must reach the student's fingertips when the arm is extended by the side. Tops must reach the top of a student's pants/skirt when sitting or standing. Undergarments must not be exposed or visible.
- * Clothing or accessories that advertise or promote items that are illegal to minors, such as alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs are prohibited. Any clothing or accessories with either pictures or words that infer, suggest, hint or imply lewd or sexual content are prohibited.
- * Clothing that is inappropriate to the environment (area or weather) should not be worn.

No shoes with cleats are allowed indoors.

Hats, caps, head wear of any kind, sunglasses, chains, and/or gang-related clothing is prohibited, unless the principal give specific approval

* Pants in which underwear is showing are inappropriate. Pants that are too big also pose a safety issue in vocational areas.

Dress that is disruptive to the learning environment, but is not specifically mentioned in the Parent/Student Handbook, is inappropriate. If dressed inappropriately, students will be told to change clothing.

If there are any doubts about the appropriateness of the attire, DON'T WEAR IT.
