DRESS CODE-For ALL High School Students: Seems like we are having a little issue with the dress code. Here is a list of inappropriate clothing that should not be worn:

- * Spaghetti straps, midriff tops, muscle shirts, short shorts or skirts as well as low cut tops or extremely tight clothing is inappropriate. The bottom hem of the shorts/skirt must reach the student's fingertips when the arm is extended by the side. Tops must reach the top of a student's pants/skirt when sitting or standing. Undergarments must not be exposed or visible.
- * Clothing or accessories that advertise or promote items that are illegal to minors, such as alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs are prohibited. Any clothing or accessories with either pictures or words that infer, suggest, hint or imply lewd or sexual content are prohibited.
- * Clothing that is inappropriate to the environment (area or weather) should not be worn.
 - No shoes with cleats are allowed indoors.
 - Hats, caps, head wear of any kind, sunglasses, chains, and/or gang~related clothing is prohibited, unless the principal give specific approval
- * Pants in which underwear is showing are inappropriate. Pants that are too big also pose a safety issue in vocational areas.

Dress that is disruptive to the learning environment, but is not specifically mentioned in the Parent/Student Handbook, is inappropriate. If dressed inappropriately, students will be told to change clothing.

If there are any doubts about the appropriateness of the attire, DON'T WEAR IT.
