The IWCOA accepted nominations from high school coaches for student athletes in each of the three state wrestling classes for the men and combined all classes for the women's award, regardless of their year in school and weight class. A committee selected by the IWCOA recently provided IAWrestle with a list of 15 finalist candidates for public input.

Fans have the ability to vote once per day for their top wrestler in each category until **Monday, Jan. 25th**, where it will be narrowed down to the top 7. (Top voted wrestler receives a nomination) Another round of voting will take place to determine the three finalists by February 8th. The fan votes will count as ONE vote towards the IWCOA's committee votes in EACH round. (For example: Wrestler A received enough fan votes to place second in the poll but that does not guarantee them to move on to the next round. IWCOA has selected 12 coaches and officials for this committee. The fan vote, this poll, is the 13th vote to break up any ties.)

The two runner-up student athletes in each class will each receive finalist award plaques. A duplicate Wrestler of the Year trophy and duplicate Wrestler of the Year runner-up plaques will be provided to each high school where finalists attend, for permanent placement in the high school trophy case.

DRESS CODE-For ALL High School & Middle School Students: Here is a list of inappropriate clothing that should not be worn:

- * Spaghetti straps, midriff tops, muscle shirts, short shorts or skirts as well as low cut tops or extremely tight clothing is inappropriate. The bottom hem of the shorts/skirt must reach the student's fingertips when the arm is extended by the side. Tops must reach the top of a student's pants/skirt when sitting or standing. Undergarments must not be exposed or visible.
- * Clothing or accessories that advertise or promote items that are illegal to minors, such as alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs are prohibited. Any clothing or accessories with either pictures or words that infer, suggest, hint or imply lewd or sexual content are prohibited.
- * Clothing that is inappropriate to the environment (area or weather) should not be worn.
No shoes with cleats are allowed indoors.
Hats, caps, head wear of any kind, sunglasses, chains, and/or gang-related clothing is prohibited, unless the principal gives specific approval.
- * Pants in which underwear is showing are inappropriate. Pants that are too big also pose a safety issue in vocational areas.

Dress that is disruptive to the learning environment, but is not specifically mentioned in the Parent/Student Handbook, is inappropriate. If dressed inappropriately, students will be told to change clothing.

If there are any doubts about the appropriateness of the attire, DON'T WEAR IT.
