<b>STUDENT-STUDENT</b>	<p>How much do you agree or disagree that each of the following statements is true? In my school:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Students in this school respect each other's differences (for example, gender, race, culture, learning differences, sexual orientation, etc.).</li><li>2. Students have friends at school they can turn to if they have questions about homework.</li><li>3. Students have friends at school they can trust and talk to if they have problems.</li><li>4. Students generally work well with each other even if they're not in the same group of friends.</li><li>5. Students have friends at school to eat lunch with.</li><li>6. Been disciplined at school for fighting, theft, or damaging property.</li><li>9. Had your things (clothing, books, bike, car) deliberately damaged.</li><li>10. Had your things (clothing, books, bike, car) stolen.</li><li>11. Been threatened or injured by someone with a weapon (like a gun, knife, or club).</li><li>12. Damaged property just for fun (like breaking windows, scratching a car, etc.).</li><li>13. Stolen something.</li><li>14. Carried a gun, knife, club, or other weapon to school or a school event.</li><li>15. Beaten up on or fought someone because they made you angry.</li><li>16. Used a weapon, force, or threats to get money or things from someone.</li><li>17. I was called names, was made fun of, or teased in a hurtful way.</li> <li>28. Other students left me out of things on purpose, excluded me from their group of friends, or completely ignored me.</li> <li>29. I was hit, kicked, pushed, shoved around, or locked indoors.</li> <li>30. Other students told lies, spread false rumors about me, and tried to make others dislike me.</li> <li>31. Other students made sexual jokes, comments, or gestures that hurt my feelings.</li> <li>32. I have received a threatening or hurtful message from another student online (like in an email, or on a phone, website or app).</li> <li>33. Something hurtful has been shared about me on social media (Facebook, Twitter, Snapchat, etc.).</li> <li>34. Adults in this school respect differences in students (for example, gender, race, culture, learning differences, sexual orientation, etc.).</li> <li>36. Adults who work in my school treat students with respect.</li> <li>37. My teachers care about me.</li> <li>38. My teachers are available to talk with students one-on-one.</li> <li>39. My teachers tell me when I am doing a good job.</li> <li>40. There is at least one adult at school that I could go to for help with a problem.</li> <li>41.
