

## GEORGE-LITTLE ROCK COMMUNITY SCHOOL

### BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

The George-Little Rock Board of Education met for special session on Wednesday, October 27, 2021 in the superintendent office in the GLR administration building in George. Board President Kristi Landis called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm with the Pledge of Allegiance. Board members present were Kristi Landis, Andrew Sprock, and Austin Lloyd. Wade Netten and Jason Fugitt were unable to attend. Also in attendance were Superintendent Tom Luxford, Board Secretary/School Business Official Cathy Bonestroo, and guest Valecia West.

A quorum was established. President Landis opened the meeting for public comment. Valecia West submitted a request to speak sharing on behalf of Sheri Stratman. West noted rumors started several weeks ago that 6<sup>th</sup> grade would be moving to Little Rock. Stratman requested that before considering moving students, shared teachers, and libraries again that the possibility of a future CTE building should be considered to bring facilities to industry standards starting to be required by the Department of Education noting some grants that are available. West also shared tightness of building with guidance, TAG, and health currently using the new art room in the mornings.

A motion to adopt the agenda was made by Sprock, seconded by Lloyd, carried 3-0.

Superintendent Luxford shared the rebid for the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor windows at the elementary building noting it was confirmed with Barber and Schilling that 3<sup>rd</sup> floor could be used for students and was not condemned. Flooring will need to be looked at from issues from turning off the heat in the past to that floor. 3<sup>rd</sup> floor would need a facelift. Principal Aeikens arrived at 5:37 pm. Aeikens shared main floor is maxed out but 2 additional classrooms are still available on 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. Open enrollment in paperwork was presented for a student already attending and in the GLR student count.

A motion to approve the consent agenda was made by Lloyd, seconded by Sprock, and carried 3-0. Consent agenda included elementary 3<sup>rd</sup> floor window bids for Pella at \$43,934.10 and Northern Plains Construction for \$38,180.00 for a total of \$82,114.10 not replacing the currently boarded up windows for summer of 2022 and open enrollment in approval.

A motion to adjourn at 5:40 pm was made by Lloyd, seconded by Sprock, and carried 3-0.
