

NOTICE OF CITY-SCHOOL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given to the eligible electors in the County of Sioux, State of Iowa, that the City-School Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2023, for the purpose of electing candidates for city, community school district, and area school offices. Some jurisdictions are holding special elections for public measures in conjunction with the City-School Election.

The polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

All polling locations for this election are accessible for those with handicap needs or accommodations. Any voter who is physically unable to enter the polling place has the right to vote in their vehicle.

All registered voters are required to provide an approved form of ID at the polling place before receiving and casting a ballot. Those using Election Day Registration guidelines or changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. Voter pre-registration deadline is 5:00 p.m. on October 23, 2023. Requests for absentee ballots are available in the Auditors' office, Sioux County's website or at the SOS website.

PUBLIC MEASURES BY DESIGNATION AND JURISDICTION**Public Measure NW – West Lyon Community School District**

Shall the Board of Directors of the West Lyon Community School District in the Counties of Lyon and Sioux, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$19,800,000 to provide funds to be used together with sales tax bond proceeds to provide funds to build, furnish, and equip additions to its educational facility, including an auditorium / fine arts addition and a wellness / weight room / wrestling addition and an elementary and secondary classroom addition, with related remodeling and improvements; to remodel, repair, improve, furnish and equip the existing educational facility; to build, furnish, and equip a new bus barn; and to make related site improvements?

Public Measure QJ – Sheldon Community School District

Shall the Board of Directors of the Sheldon Community School District in the Counties of O'Brien, Osceola, Sioux and Lyon, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$19,160,000 to provide funds to be used together with sales tax bond proceeds to provide funds to remodel, repair, and improve the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems at the high school, with related remodeling and improvements; to build, furnish, and equip additions to the high school, with related remodeling and improvements; to remodel, repair, and improve the east and north side entries; and to make related site improvements?

Public Measure TK – Rock Valley Community School District

Shall the Board of Directors of the Rock Valley Community School District in the Counties of Sioux and Lyon, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$25,000,000 to provide funds to build, furnish and equip a high school addition to the existing facility, including a related parking lot and other site improvements; and to remodel, repair, and improve the existing facility and site?

Public Measure TL – West Sioux Community School District

Shall the Board of Directors of the West Sioux Community School District in the Counties of Plymouth and Sioux, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$15,500,000 to provide funds to build, furnish and equip classroom additions to and to remodel, repair, and improve the Ireton and Hawarden Elementary Schools, with related remodeling and improvements, including demolition, and related site improvements?

Public Measure TM – City of Sioux Center

Shall the City of Sioux Center be authorized to increase the rate of the hotel and motel tax from five percent (5%) to seven percent (7%) in the City of Sioux Center effective January 1, 2024? The rate of seven percent (7%) imposed upon the gross recipients from the renting of sleeping rooms, apartments or sleeping quarters in a hotel, motel, inn, public lodging house, rooming house, mobile home which is tangible personal property, tourist court or any place where sleeping accommodations are furnished to transient guests for rent, whether with or without meals; except the gross recipients from the renting of sleeping rooms and dormitories and in memorial unions at all universities and colleges located in the State of Iowa and the guests of a religious institution if the property is exempt under Section 427.1, subsection 8 [of the Code of Iowa] and the purpose of renting is to provide a place for a religious retreat or function and not a place for transient guests generally?

Revenue Purpose Statement NV – George-Little Rock Community School District

Summary: To adopt a Revenue Purpose Statement specifying the use of revenues the George-Little Rock Community School District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund.

In the George-Little Rock Community School District, the following Revenue Purpose Statement which specifies the use of revenues the George-Little Rock Community District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund shall be adopted.

To provide funds to acquire or install information technology Infrastructure (including improving buildings or sites for the Purpose of accessing broadband digital telecommunications) and school safety and security infrastructure.

To provide funds to build and furnish a new school building or buildings; to build and furnish addition(s) to school buildings in the District; to remodel, reconstruct, repair, expand, and improve the school buildings in the District; to purchase and improve grounds; for demolition work; to furnish and equip district facilities.

To provide funds for the purchase, lease or lease-purchase of buildings, equipment (including transportation and recreation equipment), or technology and to repair transportation equipment for transporting students as authorized by law, to implement energy conservation measures, sharing or rental of facilities including a joint infrastructure project for the purposes of offering classes under district-to-community college programs as authorized in Iowa Code Section 423F.3(3)(c), procuring or acquisition of libraries, or opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings.

To provide funds to purchase land as part of start-up costs for new student construction program or if the sale of the previous student construction was insufficient to purchase land, and to purchase construction materials and supplies for a student-constructed building or shed intended to be retained by and used by the District.

To provide funds to make payments to a municipality or other entity as required under Iowa Code Section 403.19(2).

To provide funds for demolition, cleanup, and other costs if such costs are necessitated by, and incurred within two years of, a disaster.

To provide funds to establish and maintain public recreation places and playgrounds; provide for supervision and instruction for recreational activities; or for community education purposes.

To provide funds for the payment of principal and interest or retirement of general obligation bonds issued for school infrastructure purposes, energy improvement loans, loan agreements authorized by Iowa Code Section 297.36, sales, service and use tax revenue bonds issued under Iowa Code Section 423E.5 or Iowa Code Section 423F.4.

To provide funds for property tax relief; and

To provide funds for other authorized expenditures and purposes as now or hereafter permitted by law and designated by the George-Little Rock Community School District.

It being understood that if this proposition should fail to be approved by the voters, such failure shall not be constructed to terminate or restrict authority previously granted by the voters to expend receipts from the Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund.

If approved, this Revenue Purpose Statement shall remain in effect
Until replaced or amended by the George-Little Rock Community
School District.

To provide funds to acquire or install information technology infrastructure (including improving buildings or sites for the purpose of accessing broadband digital telecommunications) and school safety and security infrastructure.

To provide funds to build and furnish a new school building or buildings; to build and furnish addition(s) to school buildings in the District; to remodel, reconstruct, repair, expand, and improve the school buildings in the District; to purchase and improve grounds; for demolition work; to furnish and equip district facilities.

If approved, this Revenue Purpose Statement shall remain in effect until replaced or amended by the Boyden-Hull Community School District.
